About Mentoring

Mentoring is a hot topic in education, the workplace and community settings. Learn more about mentoring through this intensive workshop course in summer.

The course is designed to meet the needs of program coordinators and planners, mentors or anyone who wants to understand more about the potential of mentoring.

Course Outline

This course explores conceptual issues and practical concerns surrounding mentoring in various educational, community and workplace settings as a strategy relevant to all ages. Topics include:

- the concept of mentoring and assumptions underlying it;
- different models of mentoring and applications;
- essential elements of effective mentoring relationships;
- characteristics and skills of effective mentors; and
- features of effective mentoring programs.

Participants can focus on areas of interest, such as:

- developing or implementing a mentoring program;
- enhancing knowledge and skills as a mentor;
- building partnerships in their community or workplace.

Enrolment

In summer 2009 the course will be offered in the following enrolment options:

1. Professional Development (EDU471 - Audit only)

Enrol in the unit on an 'audit' basis which means you don't do the assessment and cannot claim credit for this unit should you study at Murdoch in the future. This option costs AUD\$950 (inc GST) and includes a study guide and course reader. See below for enrolment details.

2. Professional Development Course with Advanced Standing (EDU671)

Enrol on a "Not for Degree" basis and complete all assessments of the unit. This means that if you choose to study at Murdoch University at a later time, the unit can be accredited to your academic record. This option costs AUD\$1436 (inc GST). See below for enrolment details.

3. Enrol as a student in an undergraduate or postgraduate course

Students currently enrolled at Murdoch University can enrol in this unit at either undergraduate (EDU471) or postgraduate (EDU671) for 4 credit points directly through Myinfo. 4. Enrol as a Cross Institutional student

Students should arrange this through their home institution to ensure they receive credit for this unit on their transcript.
